However there are other areas safety issues may arise on campus:

- Weather
- Physical plant
- Fire
- Student behavior

- Parent behavior
- Use of technology
- Outside neighborhood, city, country or world events
- Health concerns such as allergies, asthma, other medical conditions



Standard Practice/Changing Culture

- Doors should never be propped.
- People who are out of place are noticed and approached (de escalation).
- Visitors must be buzzed in, sign in and wear a badge.
- Students should participate in drills several times a year [reverse evacuation & lock down].
- Students/Parents/Teachers should never open the door for a visitor.
- Faculty and staff should carry their walkies, keyscans and identification.
- Emergency manuals/directions are available in every room.

- Video surveillance
- CPTED (crime prevention through environmental design) is at a good level: • pathways leading to a central entryway, hill sets school building apart, set back on the property
- Parishioners/parish willing to help •
- Locking mechanism on doors
- Panic buzzers
- Location/set up of admin offices
- Master Key
- Alarm System and Excellent Outdoor Lighting
- Annual Inspections by Diocese and Sheriff's Office
- Working relationship with the Sheriff's Office
